Lego Quest – (Rec, Years 1 & 2) Miss Trinidad

If you love Lego and challenges come and join Lego Quest club. Lego Questers, together we can solve the challenge! Children can either take on a challenge or choose simply to play with the Lego alongside their friends!

Paper Plate Craft Club - (Rec) Miss Lawrence

In Paper Plate Craft Club you will be turning paper plates into adorable, creative and fun crafts. Using paint, collaging and many other techniques with materials like; feathers, tissue paper, googly eyes, cotton wool, pom-poms to name a few.

Splat Cooking
