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Admissions and Entry Procedure – Gateway School

Gateway School and its EYFS setting is a community which recognises each individual's needs and in which the talents and abilities of children and adults are encouraged. The care for each child is central to the school's aims and provision and as a caring and welcoming community. Our curriculum and pastoral approach fosters the individual's sense of identity and awareness, alongside the important role they play as part of the community. This recognition and appreciation of individuality is central to the school's ethos and is reflected in the procedures through which we welcome, admit and induct children and their families into our community.

The purpose of this policy is to enable the school to welcome, identify and admit children who will benefit from the education offered at Gateway School and who will contribute to and benefit from the ethos and activities of our school community. We will only admit a child and their family who meet these criteria.

Equal Opportunities

We welcome children from many different ethnic and racial groups, backgrounds and creeds. Human rights and freedoms are respected but must be balanced with the lawful needs and rules of our school community and the rights and freedoms of others. The School is committed to being an Equal Opportunities Education provider and is committed to equality of opportunity for all members of the school community. The school recognises and accepts its responsibilities under the law, in line with the 1976 Race Relations Act and in line with the Equality Act 2010; all candidates for admission will be treated equally, irrespective of their, or their parents' age, gender, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race or ethnicity, language, religion or belief, national or social origin, sexual orientation, property, birth or other status. We expect all of our pupils to attend all assemblies and outings, and to take full part in all Religious Education, and Learning for Life lessons.

Special Education Needs and Disability (SEND)

The School currently has limited facilities for SEND pupils but will do all that is reasonable to comply with its legal and moral responsibilities under equality legislation in order to accommodate the needs of SEND applicants for which, with reasonable adjustments, the School can cater adequately.

The physical layout of the site and buildings may restrict the movement of individuals with particular difficulties. The school has a three year plan in compliance with the Special Educational Needs and Disability Act.

The school defines a reasonable adjustment as one which can reasonably be undertaken within the normal staffing, facilities and resources of the school. Where the school needs to draw on additional expertise or resources, the cost will be passed on to parents. The School needs to be aware of any known SEND which may affect a child's ability to participate in the admissions procedure and take full advantage of the education provided at the School.

Parents of a child who has any already identified SEND must provide the School with full details at registration prior to the admissions procedure. The School needs this information so that, in the case of any child with particular needs, the School can assess those needs and consult with parents about the adjustments which can reasonably be made to

ensure that the application procedure is accessible for the child and the School can cater adequately for the child's needs should an offer of a place be made.

The School will do all that is reasonable to ensure that the information and application procedure is accessible for SEND candidates and will make such reasonable adjustments as necessary. Similarly, if SEND becomes apparent after admission, the School will consult with parents about reasonable adjustments that may allow the child to continue at the School.

Where specific needs are identified and can be met with 'reasonable adjustment' by the school there will be no additional costs for support. Where it is deemed most appropriate for there to be intervention from an outside resource, or that the pupil will require 1:1 support from a member of staff, the cost for these services will be the responsibility of the parent.

Joining Gateway School

Application: To apply for a place, please complete and sign the Registration Form. The Registration Form must be signed by both parents and then returned to Gateway School together with a registration fee of £50 per child. On receipt of the Registration Form for your child, together with the registration fee, the school will place your child's name on the General Waiting List for the term in which they expect to enter Gateway School. However, this does not guarantee your child a place.

Waiting Lists; Once a child is registered they are added to the waiting list for that year; usually positions on the list are allocated on a first come first served basis, subject to the following criteria being given precedence

- A child with an existing sibling within the school wishes to join
- A member of staff wishes that their child join the school
- A child who has previously attended the school wishes to re-join

School Visits: Parents may view the school on Open Days or on tours of the school which take place upon arrangement with the school office. Prior to admission children joining the nursery spend a session in the setting, while older children will spend a full day in the school for assessment and familiarisation.

COVID restrictions currently applied - parents may be toured at the end of the school day and need to sanitise on arrival and wear a mask inside the school buildings. Open morning will be at the school but tours MUST be pre-booked and there will be a maximum of 4 sets of parents on site at any one time

Assessment: If you are applying for a place other than EYU or Reception, your child will spend a day at the school. During the day they will:

- join an age appropriate class and complete an academic assessment
- have lunch with us, enjoy playtime with their peers and attend any specialist lessons or activities the class is involved with that day

The school will also require your child's last school report or Early Years Profile information. A reference form will be sent to your child's existing school requesting further information on your child's academic and social progress. Following receipt of this information and a discussion with the Headteacher, a formal offer will be made.

COVID restrictions currently applied- pupils are not currently able to join us for a visit day. They may visit with their parents outside of the main school hours. To assess a child's suitability for a place at Gateway School we will ask for copies of their last school report and will discuss their suitability with their parents. Once they have been offered a place and prior to starting the class teacher / tutor will contact the family and will arrange a Google Meet video call to make contact with the family.

Pupils Applying from Abroad: Individual arrangements will be made for families applying to join the school from abroad.

Sibling Policy: The school offers siblings priority for entry to the school, but the onus is with parents to inform the school of any siblings they may wish to be considered for entry.

Disclosures: Parents must as soon as possible disclose any particular known or suspected circumstances relating to their child's health, allergies, disabilities or learning difficulties.

The typical class size within the school is around 18.

Oversubscription: If the Year Group is oversubscribed, and we have to decide between two or more candidates who meet our admission requirements after all appropriate allowances and special consideration has been given, we may give preference to:-

- A child who already has a brother/sister in the school or whose parent is a former pupil here
- A child whose parent is a current member of our staff
- A child with a particular skill, talent or aptitude

Offer and Acceptance: If the school offers your child a place a confirmation letter along with an Acceptance Form will be sent to you. To accept the offered place a completed Acceptance Form, signed by both parents, along with a copy of your child's birth certificate should be sent to the School Office. A deposit is also required to secure the place; details of the deposit are outlined within the offer letter.

Deposit and Cancellation: Please refer to the School's Terms and Conditions for information as to how the Deposit will be held and in what circumstances it will be refunded. Further information is also provided in the Terms and Conditions about cancellation of a place that has been accepted.

Early Years Funding

Exclusion: In registering your child for a place at the school you are agreeing to abide by the school's regulations and policies and to ensure, in so far as is reasonably practicable, that if your child is offered a place at the school they will be both diligent in their studies and responsible in their attitude and behaviour. Should this become a problem we will make every effort to counsel your child and yourselves and encourage them to modify their behaviour. However, you must accept that it may become necessary for your child's place at the school to be withdrawn and for them to be educated at a school which is more appropriate to their needs. The Head teacher's decision in this matter will be final. Further details are available in the Exclusions Policy (available from the school office).

School's Terms and Conditions: This admission policy must be read in conjunction with the School's Terms and Conditions by which all parents and pupils must abide in relation to treatment of staff, pupils and other parents at the school.

Appendix A**Early Education Funding in Preschool**

All children are entitled to attend a free part time early education place from the term after their third birthday until they start school, up to 38 weeks per year (570 hours per annum).

At Gateway School we offer up to 15 hours per week over three mornings (five hours per session 8.00-13.00) for the entitlement. Consumables such as lunch, snacks and specialist teaching during this period is chargeable. If you have difficulty paying this charge please speak to the Head's P.A.

Please note that provision at Gateway is for 35 weeks per year. Parents may access their entitlement of up to 15 hours per week by requesting 1, 2 or 3 mornings per week. Parents who sign up to the extended provision in Preschool can claim up to 38 weeks funding per year.

Fees for any additional hours will be charged at the same net termly rate as for non-eligible children. The school deposit is refunded within six weeks of the start date for children accessing the early education funded hours only.

Fee payments are due on or before the first day of each term, in the event of a late payment, interest or late payment fees may be charged. Preferred method of payment is via BACS, details of which are on the termly invoice. A full term's notice is required in writing. Criteria for suspension of childcare due to non-payment of fees will not affect the early education funding entitlement hours.

Children are admitted to the Preschool in accordance with our school admissions policy. All children are eligible for EEF, if space is available and the child is aged 3-4 years old.
